There have been only three comprehensive legislative proposals to which these theories and arguments could be applied, no one of which was acted upon in the Congress. Purveyors of conventional wisdom have suggested that this theoretical context might be replaced within a year or two by actual consideration of a federal-level consumption tax. Some see enactment of such a tax as a desirable -- or at least a necessary -- means for reducing the federal deficit. The National Economic Commission, which was created by legislation in 1987 to recommend deficit reduction measures, was perceived...
